A JOINT LETTER FROM OUR PRESIDENT AND CEO

Dear Friends:

During 2018, VLP celebrated our 35th year of providing quality free civil legal services to those in need and effectively involving volunteers in delivering those services. Over the years, VLP has grown from a staff of 3 handling 343 cases in 1983 to a staff of over 40 that handled nearly 5,000 cases in 2018.

Our Buffalo office continued to provide a wide variety of civil legal services by staff and attorney volunteers. 439 pro bono attorneys worked on 1,921 cases in 2018 and provided over 4,380 hours in pro bono time. Lawyers volunteered to provide full representation in important matters such divorces, bankruptcies, immigration, resolving disputes with the IRS, and a variety of other types of cases. They also volunteered in our limited scope programs in Family Courts, Federal Court, Buffalo City Court (our Attorney of the Morning Program), at several Say Yes Legal Clinics, and through our Housing Hotline.

Our Batavia office continued to focus on immigration representation and assisting people detained at the Federal Detention Facility in Batavia where we successfully completed our first full year of operating a "universal representation" model for all detained low income and otherwise unrepresented people facing possible deportation.

In sum, 2018 was a very good year for VLP. We are honored, and thankful, to be part of such a worthwhile organization and to see firsthand the dedication, professionalism, and generosity of so many lawyers. With your help, we hope to assist ever more Western New Yorkers, provide a greater number of opportunities for volunteers, and help make our legal system a little easier to navigate for those in need of our help. We hope you will join with VLP and support this important work.



REVENUE FOR 2018





GENERAL CIVIL LEGAL SERVICES

IN 2018, VLP RESPONDED TO APPROXIMATELY **5**, **0000** R E Q U E S T S F O R GENERAL LEGAL SERVICES

VLP provides referrals, advice, assistance and representation in a variety of civil legal problems for which there is no right to a Court appointed attorney. The types of matters may range from representation in an unemployment benefits hearings or chapter 7 bankruptcy, to family law matters such as divorce, non-parent child custody and establishment or modification of child support, to defense of tort cases or filing of a decedent's estate to inherit a home.

UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE BENEFITS

VLP's Unemployment Insurance Benefits program helps individuals throughout Western New York with receiving unemployment insurance benefits (UIB). We help clients during the initial hearing process for benefits; we directly advocate with the New York State Department of Labor. We also handle select unemployment appeals to the Appeals Board. VLP also provides representation to clients in obtaining unpaid wages from employers.

IN 2018, VLP WON **\$80,085** IN RETROACTIVE BENEFITS FOR OUR CLIENTS

TAX FORECLOSURE

Each year, individuals across Western New York face the reality of losing their home as a result of unpaid property taxes. VLP provides individual representation to clients facing this issue in the City of Buffalo and throughout Erie, Niagara, Orleans, Wyoming and Genesee Counties. In some cases, VLP was even able to secure the funds for these families to pay off the debt that put them at risk of losing their home.


Annually, VLP sends a team of paralegals and attorneys to provide on-the-spot representation at the City of Buffalo property tax negotiation days. This year, VLP was contacted by an anonymous donor who heard about these negotiations on the news and wanted to make a difference. Due to this donor's generosity, we were able to assist multiple families and prevent the foreclosure of their homes.

In 2018, VLP's Tax Foreclosure program was responsible for creating \$175,251 in tax payer savings, \$1,307,400 in indirect value of homes saved, and \$25,363 in direct benefits.

POSITIVE FAMILIES AND INDIVIDUALS PROGRAM

The Positive Families and Individuals

Program provides free civil legal services to individuals and families impacted by HIV/AIDS in all eight counties of Western New York. This program provides representation to people on a variety of legal issues, including family law, debtor-creditor issues, HIV confidentiality, discrimination, name and gender marker changes, end of life planning, and care and custody planning.

DIVORCE

VLP has a long history of representing people seeking as well as defending a **divorce**. VLP assists low income clients who fall through the gaps created by other programs' rules. VLP has a group of attorneys committed to handling pro bono divorces, relieving a great deal of stress for the client. Clients seeking a divorce may be served by having a volunteer attorney assigned to help with all stages of the divorce, from filing the initial pleadings, to full resolution. Clients that have been served with divorce papers may get an attorney assigned to represent them to protect their interests, ensuring a default judgment is not issued against them.

VLP also represents litigants in many Family Court matters. Committed to help filling the gaps in access to justice, VLP represents Family Court litigants in child support matters, non-parent custody, and non-parent visitation.



IMMIGRATION

BUFFALO

VLP's Buffalo based immigration team handles cases for survivors of domestic violence, human trafficking, and other crimes. We also represent asylum seekers, applicants for citizenship, and other immigrants as our time and resources permit. The Buffalo office handled 358 cases in 2018.



BATAVIA IMMIGRATION

IN 2018, VLP SECURED **RELEASE FOR 1 4 8 INDIVIDUALS**

New York Immigrant Family Unity Project (NYIFUP) has been a mainstay of the Batavia office's immigration work. NYIFUP work is currently funded through a contract with the Vera Institute of Justice. NYIFUP is a "public defender" style program for non-citizens detained at the Buffalo Federal Detention Facility in Batavia, New York and in various county jails in upstate New York. Many of our clients are seeking asylum in the U.S. and in some instances, the cases are handled by pro bono attorneys. The Batavia office handled 736 immigration cases.

National Qualified Representative Program (NQRP) helps provide appointed legal representation for detained individuals who are unrepresented by counsel and have been found to be incompetent to represent themselves in their immigration proceedings because of a serious mental disorder. This work is also funded by the Vera Institute




serious mental disorder. This work is also funded by the Vera Institute of **INSTITUTE OF JUSTICE** Justice.

The Buffalo office is also home to the **WNY Regional Immigration Assistance Center. RIAC** provides expert immigration advice to mandated providers (public defenders and assigned counsel) on the immigration consequences of criminal and family law cases. In 2018 VLP represented a politician from Uganda who suffered an assassination attempt, kidnapping, several brutal beatings, and torture. We helped our client prove that the persecution he suffered was on account of his political opinion and that the Ugandan government officials were responsible for the persecution. Our client received a grant of asylum.



FAMILY COURT HELP DESK

In September 2018, the Erie County Family Court Help Desk celebrated its 5th anniversary. Starting as a small clinic open 3 days per week in borrowed space, the Erie County Family Court Help Desk is now open 5 days a week in its own dedicated space on the 4th Floor of Erie County Family Court and served 4,901 litigants in its 5 years of operation. In 2018 alone, the Erie County Family Court Help Desk served 978 clients and reduced litigation in 35.7% of cases.



March 2018 saw an expansion of the Family Court Help Desk model, with the opening of the Niagara County Family Court Help Desk. Located in the Niagara Falls Family Court building, the Niagara County Family Court Help Desk operates every Wednesday. In 2018, the Niagara County Family Court Help Desk served 94 clients and reduced litigation in 17% of the cases served.

SAY YES LEGAL CLINICS

VLP's Say Yes Legal Clinics are free legal clinics in select Buffalo Public Schools open to students, families, faculty, staff, and City of Buffalo residents. Advice on bankruptcy, child custody, child support, divorce, eviction, foreclosure, government benefits, housing, immigration, income tax, and other civil legal matters is available on a first come, first served basis, with translation services made available.



PRO SE ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (PSAP)

The extremely successful partnership between VLP, the United States District Court for the Western District of New York, the University at Buffalo School of Law and the WNY Chapter of the Federal Bar Association continued in its fifth year in 2018. VLP's Pro Se Assistance Program (PSAP) allows low income individuals representing themselves in Federal Court to seek advice from volunteer attorneys about their legal issues. Our experienced volunteer attorneys are able to assist litigants in determining the proper forum for their cases, draft and revise complaints, prepare forms requesting fee waivers and review court orders.

ATTORNEY OF THE MORNING (AOM)

AOM in 2018 1,190 cases were opened which benefited 3,261 individuals. 510 pro bond attorney hours. delayed or prevented eviction in 93% of cases, and 92% resolved by a stipulation. The Attorney of the Morning program (AOM) provides full representation to low income clients facing eviction in Buffalo City Court. Pro Bono and staff attorneys provide direct representation to qualifying individuals appearing in court on landlord/tenant matters. This highly successful program, replicated across the country, helps vulnerable families in our community avoid homelessness.

In recognizing that people across Erie County, not just those within the City of Buffalo, were plagued with issues involving landlord tenant matters, VLP launched the **Housing Helpline** in 2017. The helpline provides legal advice and counsel over the phone to low-income individuals facing an eviction outside the city of Buffalo but within Erie County.

Housing Helpline 2018 Stats


VLP received over 130 calls through the helpline. From those calls, we were able to open a total of 44 cases and assist over 100 individuals facing possible eviction proceedings.

In 2018, AOM staff assisted a single grandmother, who has custody of her three grandchildren, in avoiding homelessness. Shortly after complaining that she did not have hot water, our client received a 30-day notice of eviction despite an agreement the Landlord made to provide a one-year lease. After lengthy negotiations with the landlord's attorney, we were able to prevent the eviction and keep the tenant in her home.

LOW-INCOME TAXPAYER CLINIC (LITC)

The Low-Income Taxpayer Clinic provides representation and consultation to low-income and ESL taxpayers in Western New York who have a dispute with the IRS. These disputes include contesting the amount of the liability, providing collection alternatives when the taxpayer cannot afford to pay, and pursuing refunds for clients the IRS has disputed. The LITC also provides education and outreach to underserved Western New York communities on tax topics.

BANKRUPTCY

Many Western New York residents struggle with overwhelming debt. VLP often provides pro bono attorneys to help qualified low income clients with chapter 7 bankruptcy to give clients a fresh start. In 2018, VLP met with 87 clients seeking relief from oppressive debt, often stemming from defaulted car loans, utility arrears, or credit card debt. VLP counsels clients on their debt issues, helps to determine what property and income is exempt from collection, advises clients on how to deal with aggressive debt collectors, and refers clients to pro bono attorneys to help with bankruptcy where appropriate.

RISING CHAMPIONS FOR JUSTICE

RISING CHAMPIONSFOR JUSTICE ECBA VOLUNTEER LAWYERS PROJECT

In 2018, VLP introduced the **Rising Champions for Justice (RCJ)**. RCJ is a group of young professionals dedicated to furthering the VLP's mission to provide free legal services to low income people while gaining valuable board experience and professional development. Members support VLP through organizing events, fundraisers, networking and professional development opportunities, and through volunteerism. In its first year, VLP welcomed 21 new members to the Rising Champions for Justice from a variety of firms and backgrounds.

IMMIGRATION 101 VIDEOS

In 2018, VLP embarked upon a public education campaign scrutinizing hot topics in immigration, in a video series called **Immigration 101**. The 5 videos in the Immigration 101 series have been viewed thousands of times. Thank you to our partners Rise Collaborative and Goldfarb Financial.
